

Keynote lecture - inspired students

A keynote in public speaking is a talk that establishes a main underlying theme. A **Keynote lecture** is efficient and interactive. It leaves open space for questions instead gives all answers. It takes into consideration the students task. Keynote lecture includes a central (key note) issue with an example, but not all information from the topic. Keynote lecture leaves open space for questions and it is connected directly to the student's tasks. Leave in the end of keynote lecture open question or questions. For example you can ask: Evaluate your task from the point of view... Keynote lecture is short: 15-30 minutes, therefore it needs good planning. If there is more time to use then there are more room for conclusions. When debate really starts it activates students and inspires students for better results.

We recommended to use learning by doing method in ERDI. This means that student's assignments are the most important part of all courses and keynote lectures support them. This based on Social constructivist approach to learning, which maintains that human development is socially situated and knowledge is constructed through interaction with others. We have an experiences of learning by doing in international context and it have worked well in different subjects. Students have adopted a method well despite the fact that they are used to a different study.

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
